A message from Pastor Fred...

Grace and peace to you,

This April may seem like a roller coaster. We are coming out of Lent, a time of preparation. We've been following our "40 Days of Giving" calendar: worshiping, studying, reflecting, praying, giving, hearing, and singing week after week. Then we come into Palm Sunday, a day of great announcement that "Jesus is here!" It is a cause for great celebration. And then we find our Lord crucified, killed by the sin of humans. We are drawn into deep sorrow, and at the same time gratitude that he would do this out of love for each and every one of us. We wait with his followers' great hope that his promise is true, and on Easter Sunday the Tomb is empty! Our Lord and Savior did defeat death. He has conquered sin, and triumph is truly God's. I have witnessed St. James' ministry first hand with the Backpack program at Byrd Elementary, and it was inspirational. With Backpack, you are investing in the future of the world. You are seeing to it that the young people in our community have enough nourishment to learn and grow. Thank you for engaging in this vital ministry! This got me excited, and I found myself at Leavelle McCampbell Middle School learning about many of the ways that we can serve them.

There are many ways St. James feeds the world around us. Following the model of Jesus, we find that he doesn't just feed, but he teaches the people around him. We are called to proclaim the gospel, and we are doing just that! Our confirmands are learning all about the gospel of Jesus and engaging with their friends about what they have learned. They have all just finished their semester projects: self-selected engagements with scripture, prayer, and the church. Feel free to ask them about their projects and what they have learned. The way St. James' youth has explored their faith is truly uplifting!

We continue to feed and we continue to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. As St. James we are following God's call in our lives. If there is any ministry you wish to seek out further and are looking for accompaniment, let us know. ### Backpack Program for Byrd Elementary & Graniteville Elementary Schools



St. James Lutheran Church started a new outreach ministry in the fall of 2012 by participating in the Golden Harvest Food Bank's Backpack Program at Byrd Elementary. With the support of friends and the community, 48 students at Byrd & Graniteville Elementary Schools were able to receive the weekly food-filled backpack this year. To continue with this ministry for the 2022-2023 school year, we must begin our fundraising efforts for this very worthy cause. You are cordially invited to join us for our kick-off BBQ Dinner on May 6, 2022. All donations (100%) go to the Backpack program. *Please note that reservations are required for the BBQ.* 

#### What Is It?

This program provides children who have little or nothing to eat on the weekends with a gallon Ziploc bag packed full of nutritious, kid-friendly food to get them through the weekend. Because many of these children may not have electricity, a working refrigerator, a working stove, or a helpful parent, the food is shelf-stable and easy to open. On Fridays, backpacks are discreetly distributed to the children in the school. Golden Harvest estimates that over 1000 students in Aiken County have no food on the weekends. #### What Does It Cost?

The cost is \$5/week/child for 36 weeks (\$180/child per school year). The Golden Harvest Food Bank asks us to sponsor 40 children, at a cost of \$7200 per school year. We have surpassed our goal for the last ten years, and we'd like to continue supporting as many children as possible.
