Grace and Peace to you,



There has been quite a bit going on at St. James, particularly with our outreach. Trunk or Treat at Gregg Park is almost upon us, and we finished our school supply drive earlier this summer. Amongst the excitement, I have been listening to see where God is calling St. James next. Whether you are involved formally in outreach or not, it is our call to "Love your neighbor." That looks different for everyone, as Paul details in 1 Corinthians.

1 Corinthians 12

4 Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit.

What is it that God has been calling you into lately?

Individually, God calls us according to our many gifts. Working together as a church with our gifts is how we do ministry together in the church and the community. Recently the Outreach Committee turned its attention to using our gifts to serve our church body that is out in the world.

The committee has been discussing how we can support and encourage those from St. James who are attending college to enrich themselves, so they can serve the world through a vocation that requires more education. It is these little gifts that go a long way, and some words go remembered for decades.




