In making preparations to steward all God has given us, our Capital Fund Committee has been gathering and learning together through reading "Abundance- Creating a Culture of Generosity" by Michael Ward. He notes in the Apostles' Creed where it says, "I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth," that this makes a statement.
