A message from Pastor Fred...

Grace and Peace to you,



The earth around us seems to be well at rest. Occasionally, there has been some frost upon the grass in the morning, and even my most eager indoor plants have stopped putting forth new shoots. There is a season for everything, and the bitter cold is getting its day too. Perhaps my garden appreciates the rest as well, since I've taken to the indoors more lately and am not actively micromanaging it. Reflecting on this, I'm seeing winter as a holy time to regather our energy. I hope that you have found the rest you needed this season.

As we live into this season on earth, we are also about to enter into a new season of Lent beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. What a time: a day dedicated to love on the same day we dedicate to humility and devotion. The coming together of Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day made me consider Christ as Paul writes about him in Philippians 2.

If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, ²make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. ⁴Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. ⁵Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,

⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited,

⁷ but emptied himself,

taking the form of a slave,

being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form,

8 he humbled himself

and became obedient to the point of death—

even death on a cross.



In this new season, we're going to start a regular study of scripture. We will begin this in Bible study on Wednesdays in Lent. We will look at the upcoming scriptures that will be read in worship on the following Sunday, so that when Sunday comes, we will have discussed it together and can go into worship with additional insight. Lent, the liturgical season, may come to an end with the Resurrection of Christ on Easter, but we can continue our study throughout the year if we want to take this spiritual discipline with us through the seasons to come.

I wish for you rest and recovery this winter, and I look forward to studying scripture with you in the upcoming season.




