A message from Pastor Fred...

Grace and Peace to you,

As we continue on our journey in Lent, we look to Jesus while reflecting on our own lives. In reading over the Ten Commandments in the twentieth chapter of Exodus during our Lenten Wednesday Night Bible Study, our need for the grace and mercy of God was made very apparent. We may not be able to do everything perfectly, but God can still love us perfectly, and we can see that he does because of Christ crucified.

"For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." 1 Corinthians 1:18

It may seem ridiculous as Paul details to the Corinthians, but because God loves us and gives us life through him, we have been called into something far beyond human comprehension. Because of Christ, we understand that God loves us more than we can imagine.

In this intricate predicament of being human, we find that we've been given a whole spectrum of feelings. We can feel joy and surprise. We can be afraid, which sometimes comes out as anger. We can feel disgust or contempt. These are all valid feelings. The way that God has made you does not limit you to going through life in a state of ignorant bliss. There is so much more of God's creation for you to witness than just the gleeful feelings.

In this season of Lent, we've been focusing on a feeling that some people like to avoid: sadness. In this, we're looking at a lesser-known, but vital, spiritual practice of communicating our grief with God. God doesn't expect you to just have positive feelings. God has equipped you to feel many things, and God knows your whole self. If you're sad about something, you can talk to God about it, and communicating that is a spiritual practice we call lament.

There are things in this world that are not in line with God's Kingdom. The difficulty this brings is something we can take to God. There are things happening that hurt God's children, our loved ones. This is something we can talk to God about. There are things we do that we wish we hadn't. This too is something we can bring up to God.

This season and spiritual practice can be difficult, but it isn't something you have to do alone. As a church, we are coming together on Wednesday nights to bring our laments to God, for God hears your laments and is with you in the hardest times.

We see Christ take all of the things that go against the Kingdom of God unto himself in the cross, and we grieve what humans have done to each other, what we have done to God's creation, and what we have done to God. But it isn't humans that get the final word. For the Word, the living Word, is Christ Jesus, and we see his eternal triumph at Easter. He rises from the death we subjected him to, from the sin he took on for all creation, and we find he brings us life through his everlasting love and mercy. This promise of Christ's love is for you, and while we grieve together in this season, we rest in his eternal mercy and grace for all of time. Thanks be to God.

Wishing you peace this season as we follow Christ, reflect on ourselves, and await Christ's coming in glory. Please feel free to join us in Bible Study, dinner, and worship on Wednesdays. I find this time to be spiritually filling, and it is a joy to do it with you.






Thrivent Choice Dollars
