Letter from the President of Church Council



The purpose of this letter is to provide an update and information to the St. James congregation on measures that have been taken by Church Council to meet the ministry, worship, and outreach needs of our church during our pastoral vacancy.

The service of Pastor Bob Byrne, retired pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Aiken, was greatly appreciated during Lent and on Easter Sunday. His presence enabled St. James to use the preferred talents of Jim Cobb and Garrett Maroney in leading worship, rather than relying on an interim pastor or supply pastor(s).

Bishop Ginny Aebischer and Deacon Kimberly Heindl, Assistant to the Bishop, visited in early April to discuss leadership requirements needed by St. James after the Lent/Easter period. The following plan was decided upon after meeting with the Synod representatives and several subsequent telephone conversations discussing changes and options.

Jim Cobb

- 1. Will preach and teach the Word of God one Sunday in a four-week month and two Sundays in a five-week month and special days of the Church year and funerals (as requested by Church Council).
- 2. Preside at worship and administer the sacraments (under the Letter of Dispensation from the bishop).
- 3. Provide pastoral care to all members of the congregation according to their needs, visit the ill and shut-ins in the hospital, nursing home, or at home, and uphold all in the congregation in prayer as requested by the council.
- 4. Be available one afternoon per week for office hours and to oversee church activities as determined by council.
- 5. Attend monthly Church Council meetings with voice but not vote.
- 6. Teach confirmation as requested by Church Council.
- 7. Will be paid \$600/week plus reimbursement for all church related expenses.

Garrett Maroney

- 1. Will preach three Sundays per month.
- 2. Continue current role in teaching Sunday School.
- 3. Sing the Kyrie and other liturgy as needed at Sunday services.
- 4. Will be paid \$600/week in addition to reimbursement for expenses incurred in church related activities.

It is expected that these arrangements will enable St. James to continue to proclaim the Gospel and worship our Triune God in our traditional way until a permanent pastor is called.






